## **List of Guidelines for Ophthalmic Photos**

- 1. Resolution should be minimum 300DPI
- 2. Max size 5mb
- 3. No border
- 4. Should not be edited by software like Adobe
- 5. Image J editing is accepted
- 6. Should not have identifying details of the patient
- 7. Consent should be taken from the patient
- 8. Avoid using colored blocks to hide the patient's face
- 8. There should be no watermark or identifier regarding the doctor or the hospital
- 9. Single and composite (montage) both are acceptable
- 10. Please give a suitable caption (less than 100 words) of the image
- 11. All types of Ophthalmic photos like Clinical settings, External photography, FFA, ICGA, Auto fluorescence images, Fundus photo graphs, wide angle photography, Monochromatic images, OCT, OCTA, Slit Lamp Photography, Eye as an art etc. are acceptable
- 12. Images should be copyright free to be used by OSOS. Submitted images may be printed and displayed at the annual conference or Website or published in OSOS communications with due acknowledgment.
